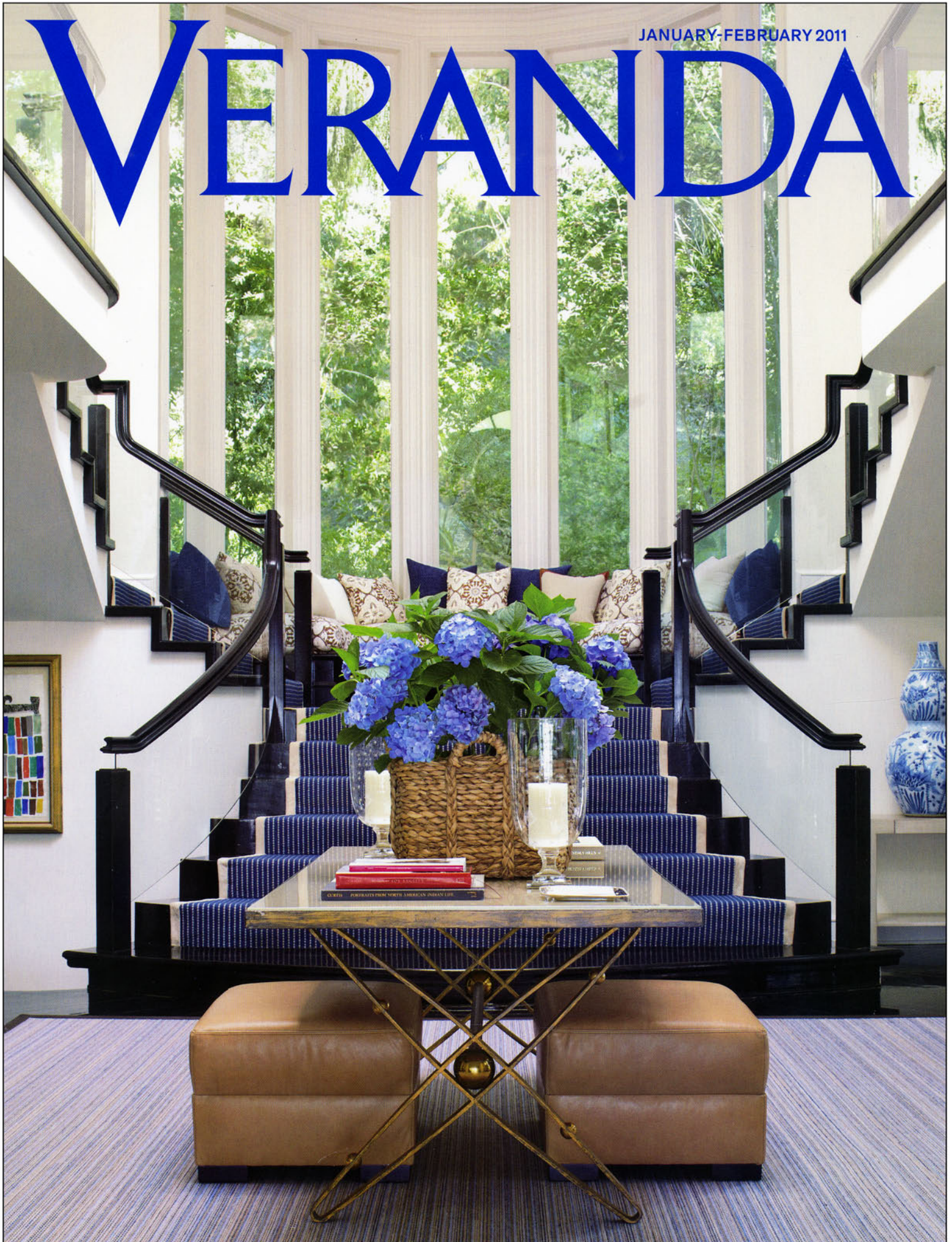

SHOCKING NEUTRALS AT THE VICEROY HOTEL

It didn't seem possible that Kelly Wearstler could be any more unpredictable. But the famously capricious and exuberant designer has defied expectations yet again—not with color, as is her usual wont, but without it.

Wearstler's interiors for the new Viceroy Anguilla resort in the British West Indies are a symphony in off-white—bone, blush, ivory, fawn—without a lipstick-pink or lizard-green anything in sight. Call it “maximalist minimalism.”

This white album is on beautiful display in the tropical getaway's Cobà restaurant. The decor is an homage to its setting: glass walls overlooking pristine white-sand beaches let the light shine in on warm woods, organic linens and all manner of coastal treasures, such as a glorious tangle of sun-bleached driftwood embellishing a banquette.
